
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#### Overview of the Report

400 surveys were collected from a random sample of adult residents in the Bronzeville community reporting on perceptions of:

- Neighborhood support and connection
- The extent to which neighbors look out for others' children
- ♦ Attitudes around violence
- Community resources



Adult residents also mapped their sense of safety and available community resources for Bronzeville teens and parents.

Collected surveys from 20 Census Tracts representing the Bronzeville community:


- Adults ages 18-39

Adult residents reported on demographic variables, including age, gender, race/ethnicity, household income, education, household size, living arrangements, and length of residence.




